### Legacy Project RFP

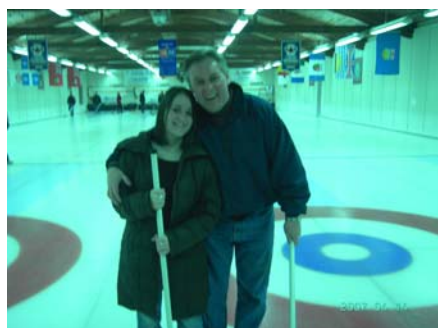

On April 11, 2007, the Salvation Army held its official opening of the newly redeveloped Wiseman Centre at the western end of Water Street. To say this new facility is impressive would be a major understatement. This \$3.6 million project now provides 10 supportive housing units and 20 self-contained shelter units for older men in the St. John's area. In his opening remarks, Major Ray Rowe, Divisional Commander with the Salvation Army in Newfoundland and Labrador stated; "This is a proud day for the Salvation Army and an important day for our community. The new Wiseman Centre will provide a safe shelter with specialized supports for older men facing challenging circumstances in the St. John's area. It's a real need that will now be addressed." While the bulk of funding for this new facility was provided through various government sources, a substantial contribution was also raised within the local community. The Rotary Club of St. John's East, through our Foundation can count itself as one of these local contributors. Our contribution of \$3,000 has helped to furnish two of the units. Projects such as the Wiseman Centre, clearly demonstrate how our work is having a tangible and positive impact on our community..
